Glatthaar gained 69 yards on his 15 carries and Moore picked up 64 on 10. For the day all three of the Bearcats three-headed attack averaged 4.6 yards a carry or more.

Bill Poland: The junior has seen his season be one of not many plays, but his touchdown catch was big in this victory.

Earnest Jackson: Jackson got some Bearcat Insider karma this week and had a big game. The sophomore caught 7 balls for 86 yards. Before it's all over Jackson will have a chance to be a great one.

Chet Ervin: All he did was average 46 yards a kick on the day. Keep in mind he punted 6 times and had one for 55 yards. But the biggest stat of the day was his 4 punts inside the 20.

Dominic Ross: Ross had a great game with his 7 tackles and a half sack.

Anthony Hoke: Hoke also got some Insider karma and placed the hit of the day when the ball was jarred away from the Syracuse quarterback and then picked up by teammate for a score.
